



WEST VIRGINIA GRABBING ATTENTION AS A LEADING GLOBAL DESTINATION FOR TRAVEL



Condé Nast Traveler chose West Virginia as one of “The 22 Best Places to Go in 2022” for its treasure-trove of outdoor adventures. The editors independently selected the Mountain State, highlighting 1,000-foot-high-sandstone cliffs for climbing, hiking, and biking trails, as well as accommodations brimming with history.

“The new Elk River Rail Trail in central West Virginia is transforming an old railroad line once used to transport coal into a hiking and biking path that, at an eventual 74 miles, will be one of the longest trails east of the Mississippi.”



West Virginia was named number two in the “Top Travel Regions” to visit in 2022 by **Lonely Planet**, joining global destinations, like Westfjords, Iceland; Scenic Rim, Australia; Vancouver Island, Canada; and Burgundy, France.

“2022 is the perfect time to discover West Virginia, a still-uncrowded region with unspoiled mountains and unmistakable heritage where the leisurely tempo of Southern small towns converges with the adrenaline sports that attract adventurers from across the continent.”

“West Virginia’s New River Gorge, encompassing more than 70,000 acres, became the country’s newest national park and preserve in December. The main artery of the park is New River, which—despite its moniker—is one of the oldest rivers in the world, with 53 miles of free-flowing white water. Towering above the river is New River Gorge Bridge, which hosts its annual BASE jumping “Bridge Day” in October—making this the only national park where that daredevil activity is legal.”

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The state is royalty in rafting and whitewater kayaking – with 2,023 miles of whitewater, the greatest density of any U.S. state, according to America Whitewater data analyzed by the WVU Mountain Hydrology Lab. In Mountaineer Country, the Cheat River is part of the largest undammed watershed in the Eastern United States. The Cheat Narrows does not disappoint with spectacular wave trains and Class III whitewater, such as Rocking Horse, Calamity, and Wind.



West Virginia has more than 4,000 climbing routes that accommodate climbers of all skill levels. Located in Mountaineer Country, Coopers Rock State Forest is a climber's treasure trove. Known for its series of sandstone cliffs and "gritstone" rock, the park has over a hundred bouldering problems and several top-rope climbs.



With lakes dotting the map and rivers running through every corner of the state, it is not surprising that **fishing is a passion for visitors and natives**. Cheat River and Cheat Lake are top destinations for fishing, 11 of the waterways dotting Mountaineer Country are stocked annually. Best known for bass, trout, and channel catfish, the area is home to more than 150 species.



West Virginia is known for its country roads, scenic views, and Civil War history. With more than 1,200 miles of maintained trails, the **Mountaineer Country offers plenty of hiking options that reveal a treasure trove of natural wonders**. Coopers Rock State Forest boasts nearly 50 miles of trails, ranging from easy leg-stretchers to long, difficult day hikes. The most popular destinations: a 1,200-foot scenic overlook and the famous Rock City with 30-foot boulders.



There is no better way to hang out together than **hanging from a zip line**. Located just 15 miles from Morgantown, West Virginia University's Adventure WV has four lines, ranging in length from 201 feet to 980 feet, connecting thrill-seekers to an aerial bridge and a 45-foot rappel station.

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
